Program- Rachel Altman, Carnegie Branch Manager, with the Bryan College Station Library Genealogy Services showed a PowerPoint presentation on the history of the Carnegie. The Bryan location was established in 1903 and it is the oldest still active Carnegie in the state of Texas. Ms. Altman provided several free websites where searches can be done for information on various topics. FamilySearch.org, newspapers.com and TexShare. Membership- 1st VP Colleen Holmes encouraged members to sign up online or by form for the 2025/26 year. She reported a total of 162 joining as of today's date.


