

PREPARING FOR THE SECOND TEXAS PRIMARY ELECTION

The election date for the second Texas Primary Election (run-off) is Tuesday, May 28. Early voting will begin on Monday, May 20 and run through Friday, May 24. The General Election will be held on Tuesday, November 5.

In TRTA District 6 first primary voting produced the following results:




